

Statement on the EUDR European Union's Regulation

The European Union's Regulation (EU) 2023/1115, known as the EUDR, aims to mitigate the EU's contribution to global deforestation. This regulation mandates that companies selling cocoa, soy, palm, cattle, wood, coffee, rubber, and certain derived products in the EU market must perform thorough due diligence across their supply chains. This ensures that these commodities and products are both deforestation-free and legally produced at their origin.

Currently, Corbion uses soy, cocoa, palm oil, and palm kernel oil and derivatives as ingredients in a limited number of our products. These raw materials are not imported or exported into the EU and as such are exempt. At this time, all of Corbion's products are out of scope of the EUDR regulation. As such, the regulations requirements do not apply to Corbion's raw materials or products. We are constantly monitoring our portfolio to ensure any new raw materials or products will meet the requirements of the EUDR if necessary.
